



Clive Baldwin (CANADA)

Clive Baldwin is Professor of Social Work at St Thomas University, Fredericton, NB, Canada. He is also the Director of the Centre for Interdisciplinary Research on Narrative. He is a former Canada Research Chair in Narrative Studies (2011-2021). His research interests focus primarily on matters of narrative identity – how people create and maintain a viable, sustainable identity in the face of non-validation. In particular, he has worked on transabled identity – the desire or need to acquire a physical impairment – Other-than-Human identity – Otherkin, therianthropes, and vampires - and spiritual identity among members of New Religious Movements and practitioners of alternative spiritualities. He has published in the fields of social work, sociology, psychiatry, law, health, disability, religion,
