



**William L. Randall** (CANADA)

William (Bill) Randall is Professor Emeritus of Gerontology at St. Thomas University in Canada, and Derek Brewer Visiting Fellow at Emmanuel College, Cambridge, for the Lent term of 2023/24. During his years of researching and writing about later life, he has focused primarily on the *biographical* (vs biological) complexities of ageing—a process in which young and old alike are involved—and how the stories by which we understand and experience our lives are forever evolving. A native of rural New Brunswick with degrees from Harvard, Princeton Seminary, and the University of Toronto, he has authored or co-authored over 70 publications on narrative gerontology, a field he helped to pioneer. Among these are 10 books, including: *The Stories We Are: An Essay on Self-Creation* (University of Toronto Press) as well as *Reading Our Lives: The Poetics of Growing Old* and *The Narrative Complexity of Ordinary Life: Tales from the Coffee Shop*, both by Oxford University Press.
